News from the classes:

Shooting Stars: We have been using number lines for adding and taking away in maths. In PE we have been practicing our jumping. We have been writing about knights.

Explorers: In Year 2 we are happy we got SATs finished. We are enjoying learning fractions in maths and have been enjoying reading the book Matilda. In RE we have been writing our own prayers about what is important to us. Year 1 have been creating stories and Year 2 have been learning about similes all linked to a short film called 'Adventures Are The Pits'. In PE we have been learning to use a tennis racket; some of us have some really good tennis ball skills. In music we have been learning to play a tune on the glockenspiels. Fynn and Imogen

Discoverers: This week in Discoverers Class we made our own compasses in Science using magnets, we used our understanding of magnets and compasses to help find the treasure on the field. We have also been planning a non-chronological report based on the cats from the story Varjak Paw. In Music we created our own Viking notation using quavers, crotchets and minims.

Voyagers: This week, Voyagers have been writing their ecosystem reports. We got to chose which ecosystem we wrote about such as deserts, mountains or taiga. They are A3 size and have to include facts and decoration. Year 5 have been learning about decimal multiplication and division by 10, 100 and 1000. Year 6 have been designing and planning their own theme parks with a budget of £4million. With a partner, they have to decide on rides, amenities, bins, benches and paving. They can not overspend!

In music, we are practising in groups ready to perform. We have had to create the music with a production in mind. In science, we have been drawing and writing about the lifestyles of a plant and learning about the parts of a flower. Thalia, Abigail, Isabel & Elsie


