Robiox's private messaging function raises the risk of children being contacted by people they may not want to speak with – potentially leading to bullying, harassment, toxicity and scam attempts. The game allows you to disable messages from anyone who hasn't been added as a friend on your child's account.

If they don't understand they're using real money, it's easy for children to accidentally spend a sizeable amount in the game. Using parental controls to piace limits on their spending will help avoid any nasty financial surprises. Ensuring that you have two-factor authentication on your payment accounts alow makes it harder tor your child to spend money inadvertently.
