News from the classes:

Shooting Stars: In Shooting Stars we have been continuing our adventures in space by taking a closer look at the planet Earth. We have learnt that the Earth is a sphere and that it is the only planet that has life due to its perfect set up of water, land and sun. In maths we have started learning to subtract; we have found it much harder to take away than to add. In phonics we have been learning new diagraphs which have wonderful rhymes to help us remember them. We have brought these home to practice.

Explorers: We had the Play Pod and we built stuff. We built jets, castles, houses, cars and even got pushed in barrels. In English we talked about adjectives to describe trees. In science we have learnt about seasons and which month is in each season. We also talked about different types of weather. Luca and Fynn

Discoverers: In maths we have been looking at multiplication and division we have used resources to help divide a 2 and 3-digit number by a 1 digit number (Yr4) and Yr3s have been looking at the number of different ways we can divide/share.

In English we have used a video hook called 'Marshmallows' to help create our own monster which we are writing a non-chronological report for. Our humanities focus this term is history and we are learning about the Romans. We have explored whether we thought it was easy for the Romans to invade Britain. Lawson

Voyagers: As part of our science topic on Earth and Space, Voyagers have created diagrams to illustrate the planets in our Solar System - lots of us have been really surprised at how big some of them are compared to Earth. In English, we have been researching facts about the Amazon as we get ready to write a non-chronological report. In maths, Year 5 have been working on written methods for multiplication and division and Year 6 have been looking at problems involving ratio and scale. We also really enjoyed our first ukulele lesson this week and can't wait to learn some more songs throughout the term! Thalia and Abigail
