Today, we looked back on attendance in Term 5. After an unsettling couple of years, there continues to be a strong focus on attendance from the Government and within Acorn Education Trust. We all know that the evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results, opening more doors for children to fulfil their potential. We understand that at primary stage, pupils' attendance is parent lead and therefore want to work with parents to encourage pupils to develop healthy attendance habits and want to come to school every day. We want all children to understand the value of good attendance and to strive to have this through developing or maintaining healthy attendance habits which, when learnt young, will stand them in good stead for the rest of their school career and working life, maximising achievement and gaining the greatest benefit from education. This is why we are celebrating. Certificates were awarded for 100% attendance and stickers for those over 98% but under 100%. Once again, it was wonderful to see how many children there were! Let's keep this up in our final term of the year.



Koinonia is our focus value this term. It is another Greek New Testament word. This one also has a rich variety of meanings: fellowship; community; union; and partnership ,which we really like as at school we think of koinonia as being a part of many different communities. We recognise that everyone's different gifts and strengths are at the service of every community we belong to. In collective worship, we considered how we learn about communities through the curriculum as well as considering how many different communities we all belong to and how included that makes us feel. Koinonia also expresses the quality of relationships within the Christian community. Christians share the relationship that Jesus has with God. In John chapter 17, Jesus prays that all his followers may be 'perfectly one' as he and the Father are one. Through him, Christians become sons and daughters of God and therefore brothers and sisters of each other. They are all members of the same family, something that we feel strongly aligned to here at West Ashton.

News from the classes:

Shooting Stars: This week in Shooting Stars we have been learning about patterns and odd and even numbers. We have been writing news about our half-term holiday. We have also been learning the story of Noah's Ark.

Explorers: In Explorers we have been learning to tell the time. We are reading and learning about the book The Magic Finger by Roald Dahl. We love the book and are looking forward to what the magic finger does to the Greg family. We have also been practising our dance for the dance festival. Fynn and Luca

Discoverers: In maths we have been learning about triangles and angles in Year 4. Year 3 have been learning about time. In English we have been reading The Mermaid of Zennor. 
